- Field trips are usually between 10-20 days duration, longer especially during the summer months, with basic living conditions.
- The project locations are rough, rugged terrain. Most travel in the field will be done by car but at times certain villages might only be reached on foot. Good physical health is essential.
- This post requires particular sensitivity to cultural issues especially in dress and behaviour, especially when working with women.
